Bob Van Liere's passion: "Growing and Hybridizing Tall Bearded Iris for Beauty, Performance and your Pleasure" PAIS February 16 Meeting Features Bob Van Liere

Bob exudes enthusiasm for growing, hybridizing, and marketing irises. He greets visitors at his garden gate with a grin and friendly hello. "Remember your grandmother's garden? Bring those memories back to life. Wander through the rows on your own or take a guided tour." From there, it's a few steps to total immersion in iris beds that span the depth of a city block. In 1994, Bob purchased 2 1/2 acres in Denver. He removed fifty dead Elm trees and in 1995 began growing iris. Iris4U is the largest source of irises in Colorado. In addition to 23 of his own introductions, Bob sells hundreds of recent varieties from other well-known hybridizers.

Bob's degree in horticulture led him initially into greenhouse management and eventually into his own landscape-maintenance business. Since 1998 Bob has

been hybridizing iris and his love for growing and hybridizing iris has turned into an obsession as well as his retirement plan. "I love to create a new flower, create new colors." Bob's 2008 introductions clearly reflect this.

Proposed BYLAWS Amendments

Article 4 Membership

- **4.1** Membership in this Society shall be open to all who are interested in the purpose of the Society. Term of membership is one year. There shall be four classes of membership: Active Member, Family, Dual Member, Youth Member, Honorary Member.
- **4.1.1** An Active Member shall be an individual/household paying dues.
- **4.1.2** Family Member (this class of membership was deleted.) Dual Member anyone with a current paid membership in a Region 15 Affiliate club may become a dual member of PAIS upon payment of dues of \$5.00 per year.
- **4.1.3 Youth Member** shall be any person eighteen years of age or younger paying dues.
- **4.1.4** Honorary Membership may be conferred upon an individual in recognition of outstanding service to the Society by a vote of the Executive Committee. An Honorary Member shall have none of the obligations of membership in the Society including paying dues, but shall be entitled to all of the privileges except holding office.
- **4.2** Active, Family, Dual, Youth, and Honorary Members shall have voting privileges and shall receive all Society mailings.

Article 5 Dues

- **5.1** Annual dues of 15.00 are payable in January. Notice of delinquency shall be given; members will be dropped after 2 months delinquency. and shall be past due March 1. Loss of membership will be automatic upon failure to renew by March 1.
- **5.2** Any new member paying dues after July 1 or later in any given year shall pay only one-half the annual dues.
- 5.2 5.3 The Prescott Area Iris Society annual dues shall be determined by the Board, voted on and passed by a simple majority of the membership in attendance at a general meeting and shall become effective in January. The fiscal year shall be from the first day of January until the last day of December.

Article 10 Amendments

These Bylaws may be amended by a two thirds majority vote of those members present at a General Meeting of the Society providing the proposed amendments have been printed and distributed to the membership at least one month prior to the meeting.
