PIONEER HOME IRIS GARDEN



little history about the Arizona Pioneer Home, which sits on a hill at the end of McCormick Street in Prescott. The Pioneer Home was established for aging pioneer miners that could no longer work and had no place to live after contributing so much to

Arizona's economy. A bill was introduced in 1909 and signed into law, contingent that the land was donated. Frank M. Murphy donated a 4.5-acre parcel on July 9, 1909 and the building was completed in January of 1911. On April 8, 1916 an addition was opened at the Pioneer home to host twenty (20)

women. In 1926, a hospital wing was constructed increasing the floor space of the facility to 53,564 square feet. Today a person must be at least 70 years old and a resident of Arizona for 50 years to be eligible to live at the home. It houses approximately 152 residents, five of whom are miners.

The newest of the PAIS Iris Gardens is at the Pioneer Home, however it is not a public garden. PAIS members donated approximately thirty-four historic and western themed iris for the garden. As of April, the donations have been planted. The current garden being utilized is temporary until the Pioneer Home completes construction of the new iris bed, which will be located just above the current site.

The meeting was called to order at 11:08AM by Sherry Williams, PAIS President

February 15, 2025 PAIS meeting minutes were presented by Kellie and approved by the board.

The Treasurer's Report was presented by Eugene Zielinski and approved by the board.

During the April general meeting, Isabel Olsen will be handing out 'Ready, Set-Showtime for Irises', which is a list of do's and don'ts for the Iris Show and Sale on May 10, 2025.

Beans and zip lock baggies will also to be handed out during the general meeting, for members to prepare for the Iris Show and Sale.

Isabel and Cynthe are the guest speakers for this general meeting.

Kathy Sisley, the PAIS Director at Large, has most of the Certificates of Insurance updated for 2025 and will continue until completed.

Cynthe Brush is in charge of the PAIS Newsletter. She will reach out to PAIS board members and other members before the next general meeting, to obtain news worthy ideas. In addition, PAIS members voted during the general meeting to have a summarization of the meeting minutes included in the newsletter.

Robin Walter of membership reported that PAIS currently had 66 family members and two new members.

Soon, PAIS members will be able to securely login to the club's website and find a list of current members' names, email addresses, and phone numbers.

Angela agreed to cover the hospitality duties for the May 10, 2025 Iris Show and Sale.

Garden updates: Sherry handed out signup sheets for each of the PAIS gardens requesting team members to help with clean ups, digs, etc.

Kellie reported that a small group of PAIS members met at the Yavapai College Sculpture Garden (Marty Boxer, Cathy Sar, Cynthe Brush, Heather Blakeley, and Kellie Smith) to remove leaf litter and fertilize all the iris beds. During the cleanup it was noted that several iris clumps would need to be divided before the 2025 Rhizome sale. The irrigation system at YCSG has been fixed and is up and running as April 24, 2025.

The Embry Riddle Aeronautical University Iris Garden has been fertilized and leaf litter cleaned by Kellie Smith and Heather Blakeley. Three of the iris were missing and should be replaced this year.

Sharlot Hall Museum's Iris Garden Beds have been cleaned and fertilized by PAIS members Cynthe Brush and Katy Standhardt and Sharlot Hall's maintenance personnel.

The newest of the PAIS Iris gardens is at the Pioneer Home, however it is not a public garden. PAIS members donated approximately thirty-four (34) historic and western themed iris for the garden. As of April, the donations have been planted. [Read article on pages 7&8 of this newsletter.] The current garden being utilized is temporary until the Pioneer Home completes construction of the new iris bed, which will be located just above the current site.
